Alan Jay Brady Obituary

Alan Jay Brady, 46, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, passed away January 3, 2017 at his home. He

was born August 2, 1970 to Larry and Amy (Sobba) Brady in Muskogee, Oklahoma.

Alan graduated from Muskogee High School in 1988 and from Northeastern State

University in 1992 with a degree in Criminal Justice. He worked as a mechanic for

Spirit AeroSystems in Tulsa.

Alan was a devoted father to his daughter Allison, 10. He shared his love of Star Wars

and soccer with her, and assisted as a coach on her soccer team. He was also an avid fan

of the University of Oklahoma football team.

Alan is survived by his daughter, Allison Michelle Brady; mother, Amy Brady and step-

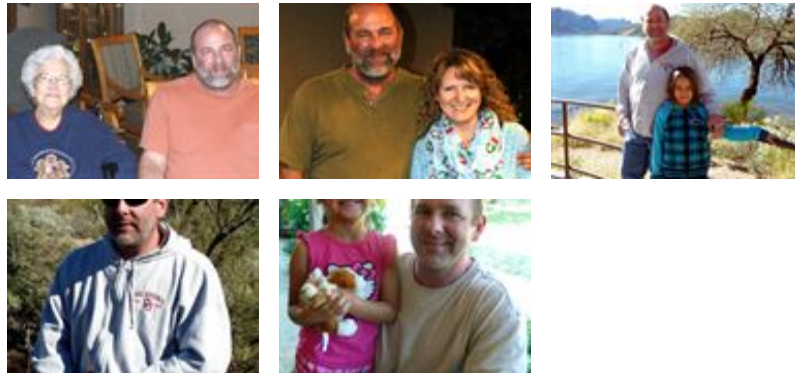
