Alice Sue Smith-Martin, 89, of Muskogee Oklahoma, passed from this life to the next on the early morning of February 1, 2025. Her time on this earth can only be described as “A life well lived”.

Sue was a devoted wife to her first husband, Lloyd Smith, who passed away after 31 years of marriage, then her second husband Bob Martin who passed away after 21 years of marriage. Christmas, Thanksgiving and birthdays were always special times and nothing made her happier than to have her entire family gathered together for these events, eating and laughing and filling her home with joy. Maybe her very favorite time together was traveling with her entire family (kids, grandkids and great grandkids) to the beach and spending the entire week together. She was so proud of the fact that her family could make this trip every year for 31 years, enjoy themselves and never have a conflict! This annual trip as a family is one of the great gifts that she gave us.

Sue also enjoyed a number of other activities throughout her life. In the earlier days Sue, Lloyd and the kids spent a lot of time camping at Greenleaf State Park in their Scotty camper and those weekend camping trips were amazing and created great memories for all. Later she and Bob traveled to many different places, sometimes to see the sights and other times to see family that lived in Arizona, California and Washington. Her and Bob also spent years on a Senior Bowling League after they retired and oh my, how many grandkids and eventually great grandkids games they attended- that's where she became known as Mema to all their friends. Sue connected with a group of gal-pals and started walking every day at the mall and she did this for years until recently when her health began to be a challenge.

Sue loved to dress and dress well. She was never seen in public unless she was fully put together and often wore something in white because that was her favorite color of clothing and whenever possible she would be sure to 'pop the collar'!

As in anyone's life, hers was not without its struggles and challenges, however she faced each one with faith, courage and strength.

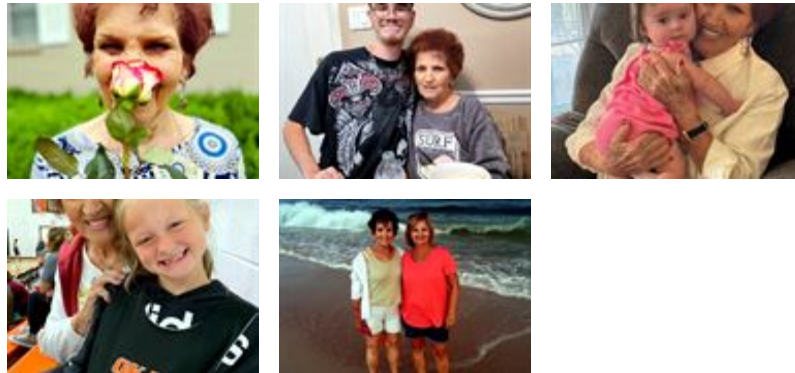
