Bobby Dean Frazier, 84, of Muskogee Oklahoma passed away in his home, Saturday, December 24, 2016. He was born September 13, 1932 to Thaddeus “Ted” Garland and Vera (Brown) Frazier in Council Hill, Oklahoma.

He joined the United States Navy in 1952 where he served in the Korean War, later receiving an honorable discharge in September of 1956. Bobby then returned home to further his education and earned a bachelor’s degree.

He married Joyce Stevens and enjoyed 26 happy years of marriage and life together prior to her passing in 1982.

Bobby began working for SRS Seeds in 1959 in Modesto, California, which later became known as Moran Seeds Inc. He had a passion and dedication for his work which lead him to become Vice President of Production and Quality Control. After 40 years, he retired in 1999 and moved from Modesto, California to Muskogee, Oklahoma.

Following Joyce’s death, he met the final love of his life, Betty Frazier, whom he was married to for 31 years.

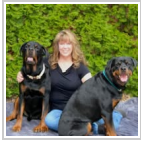

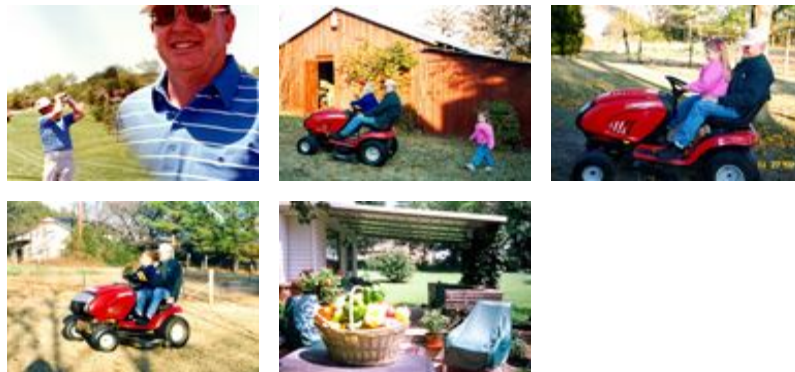
