Bobby was born to Effie and Robert Stockton of Cassville, Missouri. He was the youngest of 9 children until he was 15 years old when his brother, Tony, came along. He worked on his family's dairy farm until he became an adult. Bobby served in the U.S. Army for two years as a gunman. He worked for Muskogee County District 1 for 33 years as a heavy equipment operator. Bobby's passion was being a rancher who loved his cattle and raising gardens. He was able to pass on that passion to his grandson, Steve. His favorite thing to tell us was that he could do the work of 6 men. In all honesty; we believed him. The last month before his passing, he was still driving the streets of Muskogee and brush hog.

Bobby and Virginia were married in June of 1953 after dating for 5 years. They celebrated their 65th wedding anniversary on June 27, 2018. Although my grandmother will miss him greatly, she is grateful for the time she had with him. Bobby's last remaining sibling, Jeanne Treadway will also miss him very much. Before he passed, he told us he had a great life, he loved us all, and he was ready to go. Within minutes he peacefully took his last breath. What a

crowd there must have been that welcomed him when he entered the Gates of Heaven, especially his only daughter, Brenda Kay Hinds.
