Charlotte Dunn of 1634 Dorchester, aged 77, passed peacefully on July 26, encircled by her family within the comfort of her home. The daughter of Wesley H. and Bonnie M. Lightle entered this world in the spring of 1942. A born lover of learning, she ultimately earned both her Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from Northeastern State University in Early Childhood Education (1964) and Reading Specialism (1965) respectfully.
