Chawalit Sprayberry, 49, of Muskogee, Oklahoma passed away Saturday, August 29, 2020. He was born August 17, 1971 in Chainat, Thailand to Sompong Sprayberry and later adopted by James Sprayberry. He moved with his family to the United States at an early age. Chawalit attended public schools and graduated from Victor Valley High School with the class of 1989. After graduating from high school, Chawalit joined the United States Air Force. He was very proud to serve his country and received an honorable discharge in 1993.
