Donald Foster Cluck Sr., 79, of Muskogee, Oklahoma entered Heaven's gates on Wednesday, March 25, 2015. 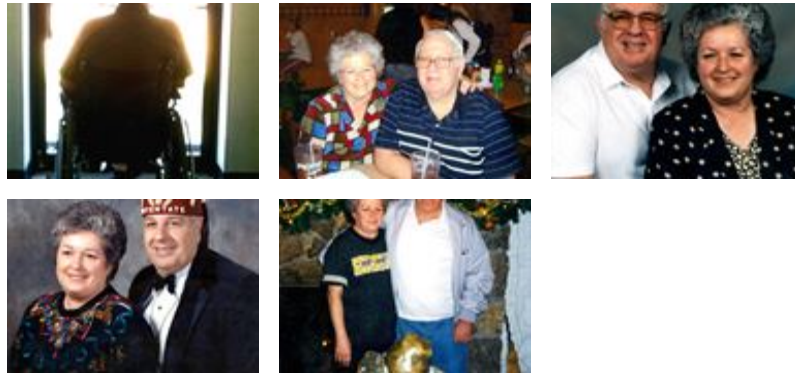
I will miss his telephone calls (some in the middle of the night) but mostly I will miss hearing him talk about each grandchild. Papaw was so proud of each of you.
