Doris Jean (Call) Phillips, 96, of Muskogee, Oklahoma passed from this life on Monday, June 19, 2023. She was born September 18, 1926 in Porum, Oklahoma to Nova Albert and Florence (Dandridge) Call.

Doris married Fred C. Phillips in 1945; sharing 64 years of marriage until his passing.

She and Fred moved from Porum, Oklahoma to Muskogee, Oklahoma in 1953 where she had grown up and continued raising their family of six children.

Fred began a new job in Tulsa working as a tile setter. Wanting to keep their family together, they moved to a home in Sand Springs, Oklahoma in 1957. In 1958, they bought a house in West Tulsa and lived there until 1961. They moved their family back to Muskogee where they bought Phillips Help Yourself Laundry.

In 1965, Doris went to work at Corning Glass where she was a decorator. Her 25-year career ended when Corning closed its doors.

Doris enjoyed spending time with her family playing dominoes, Skip-bo and marbles. She was an avid quilter. In 2021, she made each of her 18 grandchildren a quilt for Christmas. She was also an avid Atlanta Braves fan, attending many of their games.

Doris was a devoted and faithful member of Jubilee Christian Center.

Her passing will leave a void in the lives of all who knew and loved her.
