



## Dorothy "Granny" Boyd

October 22, 1923 - April 13, 2022

Dorothy Mae Crouch Boyd was born 22 October, 1923 in Pittsburg, Kansas at the home of her "goodly parents" Carl and Louise Crouch. She attended grade school, junior High and part of high school in Pittsburg. In 1938 the family moved to Miami, Oklahoma where she graduated from high school in 1940. She then attended Northeastern Oklahoma Junior College in Miami while working part time with her father at Griffin Grocery Co. It was in Miami, in high school, that she met her eternal companion, Bud. They were married 9 Feb. 1947 in Joplin, Mo. They were later sealed for time and eternity in the Salt Lake Temple on 10 October, 1960. Dorothy and Bud spent the first 9 months of their marriage in Kansas City before moving to Muskogee in 1948. To this marriage were born three children: Carl Stephen, Susan Myra who died in infancy, and Melissa Kay. Dorothy worked for many years at Muskogee Supply, Inc. as bookkeeper. She was a faithful member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints almost all of her life, having been baptized when she was 17, and held most all positions for women in the Church. Dorothy loved the Church, her family, her friends, beautiful music, flowers, trees and life! She is survived by her two children, Steve and wife, Kathleen of Syracuse, Utah, Melissa and her late husband, John Barrett of Muskogee. 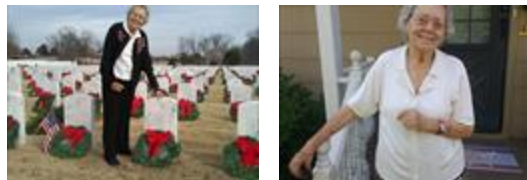
