



Earnest Ray Osmon

Earnest “Ray” Osmon, 67, longtime resident of Muskogee County, passed away Friday afternoon, June 2, 2017. He was born October 10, 1949 in Billings, Montana to Earnest Ray “Shorty” and Sophie (Remick) Osmon. He grew up in California and attended the public schools in Delano, CA. His family moved to the Muskogee area in 1976.

He always enjoyed being around cars and trucks. He drove semi trucks for many years before working with his son, Devlin, at Okie Chop Shop and later opening his own mechanic’s garage, Outlaw Customs.

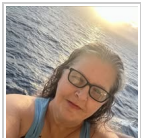
