



## Garland Dean Dickmann

November 14, 1930 - April 23, 2023

Garland Dickmann was born Garland Virginia Dean, only child of Ray and Fern in Lepanto, Arkansas on November 14, 1930. She peacefully graduated to Heaven on April 23, 2023 with family at her side. She spent most of her early years in Memphis where she graduated from Southside High School in 1948.

Garland was preceded in death by her husband, Donald Eugene, whom she married in 1951.

In her professional life, she was a leader in every role she played. She began her career in Memphis, Tennessee as an administrative assistant with Quaker Oats. Once her family was established in Oklahoma, she worked at Bowl-A-Rama where she taught many of Muskogee's youth. Garland also served in many leadership capacities in the Muskogee Women's Bowling Association as well as the Oklahoma Women's Bowling Association. She later worked for Muskogee County and then retired from the Veterans Administration at the age of 62.

In her personal life, Garland was the family's rock and a guiding light for her husband, her children, and all those who knew her. She leaves a vacancy behind in the hearts and minds of her family and friends. And while her traditional love is no longer present, her unconditional spiritual love will forever be with us.

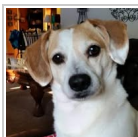
