



Hazel Vevada Haworth

June 19, 1921 - June 19, 2024

Hazel Vevada Haworth (née Baggs), a loving Mother, Grandmother, and Aunt moved on peacefully from this world June 19th, 2024 in Muskogee, Oklahoma, on her 103rd birthday.

The eldest of five children, Hazel was born in Pickens, Oklahoma on June 19th, 1921 to Oley and Matilda Baggs. As a child she attended a one-room rural schoolhouse while helping maintain the family farm and caring for her younger siblings.

Shortly after graduating from Eastern Oklahoma College, with World War II in full swing, Hazel moved to Oklahoma City where she worked for Douglas Aircraft as a “Rosie the Riveter”, helping assemble the legendary C-47 Skytrain.

After the War, she began work for the JC Penney Department Store where she met her future husband, Ura Calvin Haworth. They were married on September 3rd, 1949, and

soon thereafter would grow the family by welcoming a daughter, Janice.

In 1968, the Haworths relocated to Muskogee where they would join West Side Church of Christ, the congregation Hazel remained a dedicated member of for over fifty years.

After the passing of her beloved Ura in 1993, Hazel kept very active in her church and community. She held a deep affinity for nature and was an avid life-long gardener. She adored hosting tours of her famously vibrant backyard garden, which was frequently visited, and once chronicled as a full-color pictorial in the Muskogee Phoenix newspaper.

A fast friend to everyone; she loved to travel, loved to laugh, and was a lighthearted prankster that found endless joy in bringing amusement and light to others.

She is survived by her daughter, Janice Morrow; grandchildren, Melissa Morrow and Matt Morrow; and her many beloved nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Funeral services for Hazel will be at 10AM, Friday, July 5th, 2024 at 10:00am at Cornerstone Funeral Home Chapel.
