Henry Frank "Hank" Patocka, 89, of Muskogee, Oklahoma passed away Friday, August 16, 2013. He was born March 23, 1924 in Hennessey, Oklahoma to Frank Patocka and Anna Schovanec Patocka. Hank joined the United States Army serving in World War II as a Staff Sergeant. He later received an Honorable Discharge in February 1946. After returning home, Hank married Mattie Lou Holcomb on August 17, 1946. Hank and Mattie were blessed with twin daughters, Carolyn and Marilyn. He loved and cared for his family moving them to Muskogee so his girls could attend Oklahoma School for the Blind. He worked for Ford Dealerships until his retirement in 1984. Hank was a member of the Azalea Church of Christ.

Hank was preceded in death by his parents; his wife of 33 years, Mattie Patocka; his sisters, Mary Maly, Anna Aten, Della Kokojon, Bea Goodpasture, and his brother, Malvan Patocka.
