Inez was a wonderful cook and her culinary skills included the most wonderful ice cream cakes you can imagine! She prepared three

healthy meals everyday and made sure that we were all nurtured. Bert and Inez enjoyed a quiet but loving life together with many evenings sitting on the porch content just being with each other. Jennifer and I would sometimes interrupt their serenity by insisting they come into the house and patiently watch our programs that we concocted and unashamedly performed on the hearth of the fireplace in their living room. They became our fan base and cheered us on all the while knowing we were talent challenged!

As I look back with many fond memories of my time spent with Inez and her family I realize these really were "those lazy crazy days of summer"!

Inez was a blessing to her friends and family. She was a wonderful wife, mother, daughter, grandmother, sister and aunt and will be sorely missed by all.
