Jennie was born on October 27, 1921, near Carthage, MO, to Blanche Robb Hull and Harlie H. Hull. Jennie grew up in Wentworth, MO, and as a teen, worked in a peony nursery in Sarcoxie.

After graduating high school in Pierce City, MO, she married the love of her life, Lowell O. Reid. They were married in Springfield, MO, by her uncle, Rev. Fred Robb.

Jennie was a much loved wife, mother, and homemaker as they raised their three children, Don, Dee, and Jan, near Seneca. Her children fondly remember her having daily Bible studies each morning before the school day began, teaching them as young children about the love of Jesus.

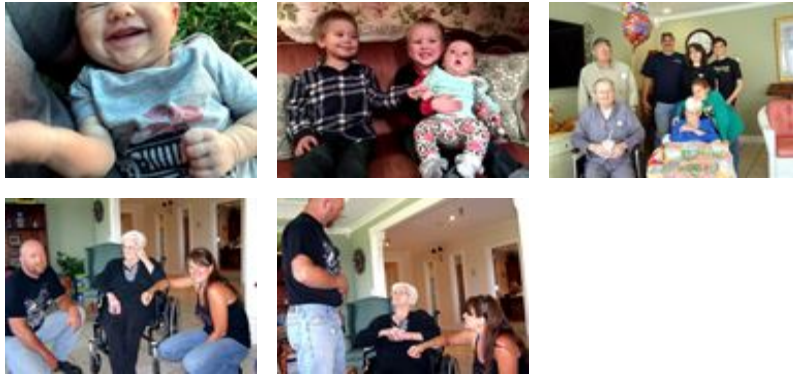
