



## Jerry Wayne Frazier

September 21, 1950 - May 13, 2016

Jerry Wayne Frazier, 65 of Warner, passed away Friday, May 13, 2016 in Tulsa, surrounded by his family. He was born September 21, 1950, in Porum, Oklahoma to Pete and Flora (Sherman) Frazier. He grew up and attended the public schools in Warner, graduating with the class of 1969.

After graduation, Jerry enlisted with the United States Air Force in January of 1970. He served his country faithfully and received an Honorable Discharge. He then furthered his education and attended Connor's State College, receiving an Associate's Degree. Jerry's professional career was spent with OG&E; he enjoyed working with them for over 30 years, retiring in 2007 as a Lineman Supervisor.

Jerry's family recalls how much he enjoyed being outside. He stayed busy and was an avid fisherman. His daughter Courtney remembers his favorite bit of advice to her, 'give them your smile everyday because someone needs it more than you do.' Most of his family and friends knew Jerry by two nicknames, "Red Dog" or "Rev"; names he enjoyed being called and knew that it was someone close when they used those names. 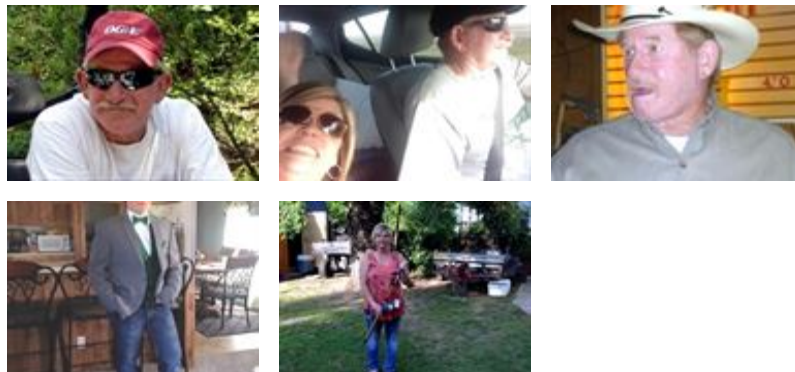
