Kenneth L. Luck, age 74, passed away on Tuesday, April 23, 2019, at Jack C. Montgomery VA Medical Central in Muskogee. He was born September 17, 1944, in Walnut Ridge, Arkansas, and was later adopted by W.B. and Erma Luck of Muskogee. He was a 1962 graduate of Muskogee Central High School as well as a 1967 graduate of Northeastern State University. He married the love of his life, Carolyn Couch, on September 1, 1967 who he was married to for 51 years. He accepted Christ at an early age and served as a song leader at the Central Church of Christ in Muskogee for several years. In 1968, he was drafted into the United States Army and served his nation in the Vietnam Conflict as a Field Artillery Specialist. Kenneth truly lived life to the fullest and had an affinity for vocal music as well as influencing & mentoring countless young men through his love of baseball. 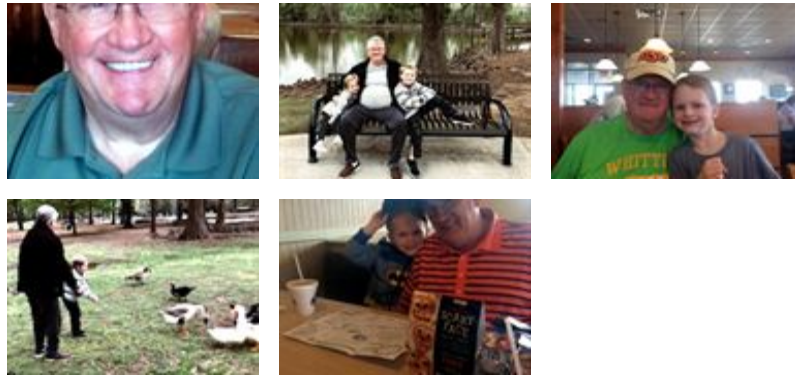
