Marilyn Joyce Stout, 87, of Bixby, Oklahoma, formerly of Muskogee, passed away peacefully Sunday, December 8, 2019. 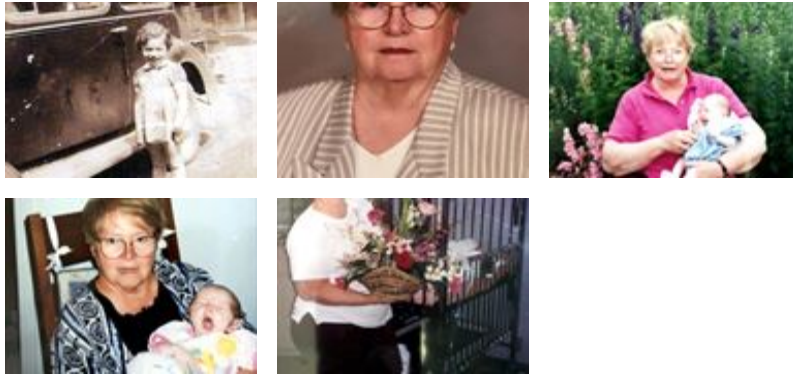
