Your photo tribute to your Dad's life was awesome to look at. I am so glad I got to visit with Uncle Marvin and Aunt Betty just last year in Muskogee.

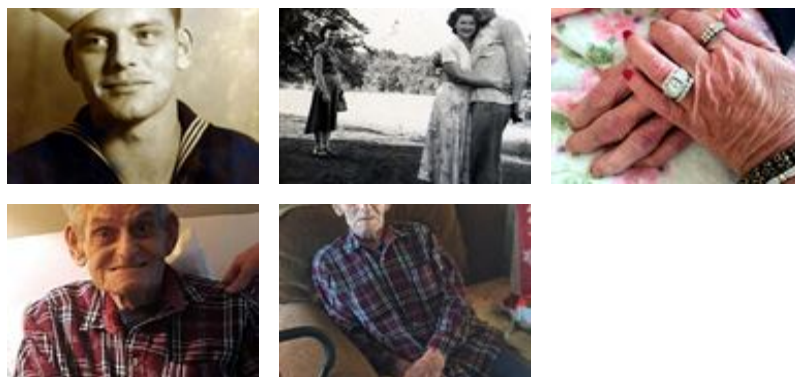
