Mary A. Warren, 98, of Muskogee, OK, beloved wife, mother, grandmother, and devout Christian, died Monday, April 7, after a brief illness.

She was predeceased by husband, James “Red” Warren and eldest son, Tommy “Kayo” Warren.

She is survived by her daughter Mary Lundy of Muskogee; son and daughter-in-law, David and Maggie Warren of Claremore, OK; and daughter and son-in-law, Judy and Bill Williams of Maumelle, AR. She was “Grandma,” “Mimi,” and “Me-maw” to eight grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren, and two great-great-grandchildren.

Born in Stillwell, OK, Mary took advantage of every one of her 98 years on Earth. Family and church were at the center of her life, as well as her medical career in nursing.

She had a lifelong passion for service to other people. She was a Sunday school teacher and a leader in Women’s Missionary Union, Trucker’s Ministry, and Eddie Warrior’s Women’s Correctional Center Bible study ministry. At 89, she volunteered with the Oklahoma Disaster Relief Team, serving Louisiana communities during the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina.

Mary also had a deep love for antiquing and found great joy in the camaraderie and friendships she built while working at the Olde America Antique Mall. She was an accomplished quilter, awesome jelly-maker, killer domino and card player, and celebrated reciter of poems and jokes.

The family will greet friends from 5-7 p.m., Monday, April 14, at Cornerstone Funeral Home in Muskogee.

Funeral service will be at 12 noon Tuesday, April 15, at Oldham Baptist Church in Muskogee with Bro. Glen Little officiating. Burial will be at 2:30 p.m. at Fort Gibson National Cemetery.
