Nora Vernia Hunter, 95, of Muskogee, Oklahoma passed away Saturday, June 21, 2014 at her home with her family at her side. She was born March 4, 1919 in Tamaha, Oklahoma to Henry Garfield Rogers and Mattie Pernina (Wilson) Rogers. Nora attended Pitcher Public Schools to the 4th grade and then to Fort Gibson Public Schools to the 8th grade. She obtained her GED in 1993 at the age of 74, something she was extremely proud of.

Nora met and later married Arthur Clinton Hunter on September 11, 1937 in Arkansas.

She worked at Swift & Co from which she retired in 1973 and later for Motters Bookbinding.

Nora's hobbies included crocheting and watching baseball. Her love was bowling. She bowled twice a week for 41 years (till she was 94) until her health wouldn't allow her to continue. She was a member of the "Grandparent's Program" at Grant Foreman School until she was 82 and was named "Grandparent of the Year" in 1993. She was a charter member of Riverside Christian Church where she was an active member until it combined with York Street Christian Church where she continued to faithfully serve in many ways. Nora was loved by many and will be greatly missed.
