Rodney LaVerne Brassfield, 77, of Braggs, Oklahoma passed away on Thursday, June 4, 2020. He was born on June 3, 1943 to Vernon Brassfield and June (Stockton) Brassfield in Muskogee, Oklahoma. He attended Howard Chapel Elementary, Alice Robertson Junior High, Central High School Class of 1961, Connors State College, and Northeastern State College Class of 1977. On March 18, 1964 he married Helen Marie (Royse) Brassfield. They spent over 56 memorable years together.

Rodney was a teacher at Hilldale Middle School for many years before retiring in 2006. He also worked at the Muskogee Police Department, and proudly served in the United States Army during Vietnam.
