



Stanley "Dale" Whitby

September 7, 1935 - October 24, 2019

Stanley "Dale" Whitby, 84, of Warner, Oklahoma passed away on Thursday, October 24, 2019 in Muskogee. He was born on September 7, 1935 to Stanley and Jessie Mae (Skinner) Whitby in Muskogee, Oklahoma. Dale grew up attending Muskogee Public Schools and graduated from Muskogee Central High School with the class of 1953.

Dale married the love of his life, Fern Caudell on February 7, 1959 in Muskogee, Oklahoma. They shared many years of life and marriage together until April 1999, with Fern's passing.

In high school and just after Dale was a bareback bronc rider. He worked at Otasco in Lakeland Shopping Center prior to joining the U.S. Corps of Engineers as an electrician, retiring in 1994. He was the 1st Fire Chief of Warner Volunteer Fire Department, serving from 1971-1991. Dale was a member of the Warner School Board for several years. He was a part of the group that formed the Warner High School Quarterback Club. Dale was also a member of the Porum Masonic Lodge #351 for 50 years.

Dale loved his family very much and was very active in the lives of his daughters, whether sporting events or livestock shows. He was very active in Warner and Porum 4H and FFA. He was the inventor of E-Z Pac Feeders for show animals. Dale continued this involvement with his grandkids and their activities. Dale will be missed by everyone who knew and loved him.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Stanley and Jessie Whitby; Father and Mother In-Law, Argle and Connie Caudell; sister, Barbara Bass; infant

brother, Stanley Whitby, Jr.; and special nephew, David Bass.

Dale is survived by his daughters, Treasa Morgan and husband Ron of Muskogee and Daelene Lindsay and husband Greg of Porum.
