WC (Dub) Cochran was born November 5, 1941 in Ada, Oklahoma to Ozzie Faye (Ward) Cochran and EV Cochran. He passed away Saturday, February 22, 2025 in his home surrounded in love at the age of 83.

He married Betty Sue Prater on November 12, 1964 in Moore, Oklahoma at the home of Betty Sue's sister. The first of three daughters, Brenda Sue was born on August 17, 1966, followed by Lori Gail on November 29, 1968, and Carrie Lynn on November 20, 1969.
